My dear Miss Clough

Yours enclosing family records from Miss Alice P. Goodwin received. I have copied some of it - and find we both trace to Thomas Blanchard 1st, who came from London in the ship Jonathon in 1639, through Samuel son of Thomas, and Miss Goodwin through John his brother. There is conflicting testimony as to whether John was a brother of Samuel or not. I believe he was and Rev. Edmund Harvey Blanchard a cousin of father procured records from a manuscript book kept by my ancestor Samuel about sixty years ago and he puts down John as brother to Samuel so I think the Goodwins are right in their records.

I think when Miss Goodwin's sister returns that she can straighten out the little snag that I have stopped at. Thanking you for writing and sending me the records I am very truly yours John S. Blanchard

P.S. I found in the Canterbury records I think it was, that widow Azuba Blanchard; married Capt. Thomas Clough, as I remember it - was about 1812. You probably have a record of it J.S.B.
