

FOR FIFTY-FOUR YEARS.

J. C. Hutchins of East Concord Has  
Creditable Railroad Record.

EAST CONCORD, Feb. 10.—Fifty-four years on the railroad, fifty years of which has been served as engineer on the old Concord line or Boston and Maine railroad, is the creditable record of John C. Hutchins of East Concord. He began as a section hand and later obtained a position as fireman, which he held for two years. He was set up as an engineer in 1861, completing his half century today.

This record is still further notable in the fact that, in all these years of faithful service, Mr. Hutchins has never had an accident of a serious nature, and has not laid off any length of time on account of sickness.

Mr. Hutchins was born in Canterbury seventy years ago this month, and is the son of the late John H. and Elizabeth (Dow) Hutchins. He came to East Concord with his parents when a boy and has been a resident here for about sixty years. He married Miss Caroline Curtis of this town, and they reside in a handsome residence on East Penacook street

Mr. Hutchins is an earnest and devoted member of the East Congregational church and has always been prominently identified in all good work and improvements.
