Henry Winslow McDaniel, a well known resident of this city, died Sunday at his home 877 Central street. His death was due to phthisis pulmonalis. Mr. McDaniel had lived in this city for 30 years, having moved here from Concord. He was born in Northfield July 29, 1843, the son of William and Sarah (Dow) McDaniel. He is survived by a widow. Funeral services, conducted by Rev. J. T. Hooper, were held from the home Tuesday afternoon. Interment took place in the Sanborn cemetery. The bearers were George E. Dorman, Edward Franklin, R. E. Bean and Albert Clark. Mr. McDaniel was a veteran of the civil war and George A. Harmon and Thomas Austin of George F. Sweatt Post, G. A. R., were delegates at the funeral from the Post.

The sudden death of Joseph McDaniel which occurred Thursday evening, Feb. 21, brought a shock to the citizens of Concord, who had known him as a resident of that city for many years. Mr. McDaniel was born in Canterbury April 4, 1860 and was a son of Joseph McDaniel. For a number of years he has followed the vocation of railroad engineer and it was at his post of duty where he met his sudden death. He is survived by a wife, one son, Frank B. McDaniel, father and three sisters. He was a member of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, No. 572 of Woodsville and was held in the highest esteem by a wide circle of friends winning them by his genial manners. Services were held Sunday, Feb. 24, at the Baker Memorial church in Concord.
