NOYES—PILLSBURY.

First Wedding Service in Webster  
Congregational Church.

WEBSTER, June 22.—One of the most brilliant events of the season was held in the Congregational church at Corser hill, Webster, it being the first wedding service ever performed in that edifice, when Ivah Louise Pillsbury of this town and Arthur Edwin Noyes of Concord were united in marriage by the pastor, the Rev. J. Henry Bliss.

The wedding march was given by the organist, Charles Watson, with cornet accompaniment by Mr. Dean of Malden, Mass. The bridesmaid was Grace E. Noyes, a sister of the groom, and a cousin, Lester G. Noyes of Canterbury, officiated as best man.

A reception at the home of the bride was followed by a wedding repast. Mrs. Noyes is one of Webster's best known young women and a student of the Moody Institute of Northfield, Mass. Mr. Noyes is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Edwin Noyes of East Concord. He is a member of Rumford grange, is prominent in church work, and has an excellent position at the Concord railroad shops.
